Klaus Wiedner

Director Financial Stability, Sanctions and Enforcement, DG FISMA, European Commission

Director in DG Financial Services and Markets for financial surveillance and crisis management responsible inter alia for monitoring financial markets and institutions, contributing to the completion of the Banking Union, country surveillance, macroeconomic policy, impact assessment of financial sector regulation, bank resolution in close cooperation with the Single Resolution Board, coordinating foreign policy sanctions at the level of the European Commission and developing Europe's role in the financial sector globally.

Earlier positions in the European Commission included Head of Unit for Banking Regulation and Supervision, Insurance and Pensions, and Procurement. Before joining the European Commission competition expert in the Austrian Ministry for Economic Affairs.

Mairead McGuinness

Commissioner for Financial Stability, Financial Services and the Capital Markets Union

Mairead McGuinness is the European Commissioner for financial services, financial stability and Capital Markets Union.

The Commissioner's vision for the portfolio is focused on ensuring the financial sector's strength and stability, so that it can deliver for people, society and the environment. Before joining the Commission in October 2020, Ms McGuinness was First Vice-President of the European Parliament from 2017. She served as an MEP from Ireland for 16 years, and was a Vice-President of the Parliament since 2014.

As Vice-President, she oversaw relations with national Parliaments, led the Parliament's dialogue with religious and philosophical organisations, and had responsibility for the Parliament's communication policy.

During her time in the Parliament, Ms McGuinness sat on a range of committees, covering agriculture, environment, public health, budgets, petitions and constitutional affairs. Her legislative work included leading for the EPP Group on the European Climate Law, the revision of medical devices legislation, and CAP reform post-2013. As an Irish Member of the European Parliament (MEP) representing the border region, she was outspoken on Brexit and the consequences for the EU and Ireland.

In 2006-2007, Ms McGuinness chaired the Parliament's investigation into the collapse of the Equitable Life assurance company which identified issues around weak financial regulation.

Prior to becoming an MEP, she was an award-winning journalist, broadcaster and commentator.



Anne-Françoise Mélot

Head of Unit, Free movement of capital and application of EU law, DG FISMA, European Commission

Anne-Françoise Mélot is Head of the Unit "Free Movement of Capital and application of EU law" in the Directorate General for Financial Stability, Financial Services and Capital Markets Union (DG FISMA) of the European Commission.

Previously Anne-Françoise had worked in DG FISMA as Deputy Head of the financial reporting unit and of the corporate governance and social responsibility unit, where she was responsible for the revision of the anti-money laundering directive.

Before joining the European Commission in 2001, she had been manager in the Luxembourg audit and assurance practice of KPMG.

She specialised in the audit of financial institutions and insurance and reinsurance companies.

In 2000, she qualified as a certified public accountant (Réviseur d'Entreprises).

She holds a degree in Engineering and Business Administration from Hautes Etudes Commerciales (HEC) Liège, Belgium and University of Trier, Germany.

She also holds a degree in General and International Management from University of Alabama, USA.



Olav Jones

Deputy Director General, Director Economics & Finance, Insurance Europe

Olav Jones is the Deputy Director General & Director Economics and Finance at Insurance Europe, the federation which represents the European insurance industry.

He is based in Brussels and responsible for all issues relating to Prudential Regulation, Financial Reporting, Investments and International Affairs.

He is also a member of the European Insurance and Occupational Pensions Authority (EIOPA)'s Occupational Pensions Stakeholder Group (OPSG).

After studying Engineering and then Finance, he started his career as a consultant to the financial services industry with Oliver, Wyman and Company. He then spent 15 years in the insurance industry working at Prudential Plc, Fortis Insurance and Ageas in roles relating to risk, capital management and strategy including Group Chief Risk Officer.



Ilya Bruggeman

Director, Digital, Single Market & Consumer Policy, EuroCommerce

Mr. Ilya Bruggeman is the Director for Digital, Single Market & Consumer Policy at EuroCommerce, the European voice for retail and wholesale.

In this position, he has been leading EuroCommerce's activities in a broad range of policy issues since 2013.

He advocates for a more competitive Single Market for retail and wholesale, supporting high customer trust in all sales channels and always trying to strike the right balance between the interests of all stakeholders and effective and efficient enforcement of EU law. He started his career in 2006, working for Public Matters, a leading public affairs consultancy in the Netherlands. George Dellis

Professor of Public Law at the University of Athens, Academic

George Dellis is a professor of Public Law at the Athens Law Faculty, Head of the LLM programs of the same School in the fields of Public Law and a former member of the Greek Supreme Special Court (2019-2021).

Dellis was born George in Athens (1967). He graduated from the Athens Law Faculty in Greece in 1988, before following postgraduate studies in Paris France (Université Paris II- Pantheon Assas). George obtained a PhD in 1994 with distinction (très honorable avec félicitations du jury) working on the relationship between administrative and criminal law in the field of administrative sanctions. He was also attributed the ability to teach and to conduct researches in French Universities (habilitation à diriger des recherches en Droit).

After teaching as a Lecturer at the European Institute of Public Administration in Maastricht (1994), George joined the European Court of Justice in Luxembourg (currently, Court of Justice of the European Union) as Référendaire (legal assistant) at the Cabinet of the Advocate General, Mr. Cosmas between 1996 and 2000. As of 2003, George teaches at the Athens

Law Faculty together with other academic institutions in Greece and abroad (mainly, Sciences-Po in Paris France, Bahcesehir in Istanbul Turkey and UMich Law School, Ann Arbor, MI, US). As of 2019, he represents Greece at the High Council of the European University Institute in Florence.

George has also served as judge, member of the Greek Special Court of art 99 of the Hellenic Constitution (2018) and of the Greek Supreme Special Court (2019-2021). He combines academic activities with liberal profession, being member of the Athens Bar Association and practicing mainly before the Supreme national and European Courts.

He has been appointed by the Hellenic Government or Parliament in various committees for the preparation of legislative texts. George's fields of expertise include all various fields of public law, both domestic and European. George has published various legal books and numerous articles or contributions in collective works, in Greek, English and French.



Tomasz Dolny

Deputy Head of Unit, Free movement of capital and application of EU law, DG FISMA, European Commission

Tomasz Dolny is a Deputy Head of the Unit "Free Movement of Capital and application of EU law" in the Directorate General for Financial Stability, Financial Services and Capital Markets Union (DG FISMA) of the European Commission.

He works at the intersection of internal market, financial services and investment law.

Previously, he was a Deputy Head of Unit in the Secretariat-General of the Commission coordinating the Commission's institutional relations with the Committee of Permanent Representatives (Coreper II), the General Affairs Council and the European Council. Tomasz had also worked on the financial services policy coordination in the Secretariat-General and on consumer and contract law in the Directorate-General for Justice and Consumers.
